Update on Biodiversity – It's Nibley, naturally ……

A CALL FOR COMMUNITY ACTION : all Parish, District and County Councils require a Biodiversity Policy and at its July 2024 meeting the Council approved its first policy. This is only the first step into making a positive difference for 'biodiversity into practice' and as six volunteers with various other responsibilities and limited expertise, Councillors' wish to seek help from our local community.

Do you have any expertise or enthusiasm for biodiversity in the Parish? We'd love to hear from you and to be involved in reviewing land owned by the Parish Council including the Quarry, part of the Knoll and the Recreation Field offering up ideas to help manage these spaces better with biodiversity in mind, whilst ensuring these areas can be enjoyed for their original purposes.

Once able to demonstrate the benefits of managing land in that way, we will seek to encourage other areas to be managed like that too. Ultimately, we hope to encourage activities on a scale across the Parish that makes a really positive difference for biodiversity. It feels like the potential and the willingness is there, and we hope the Council will be able to act as a facilitator to pull the different strands together. Most readers will be familiar with the Village Shop (or in its current guise T & Cakes) but for those who aren't, the shop operated for many years as a private business. When, in the early 2000s, the owners wished to retire the shop was bought on behalf of the village and the Association set up. Many villagers bought shares to fund the purchase and the shop was then run by the Association and managed for many years by Jenny Wytchard and staffed by her and volunteers. Gradually sales dwindled as did the availability of volunteers and just before the pandemic, after a brief tenancy by Sheryll Jones, it closed as a shop and reopened as a village hub under the enthusiastic guidance and leadership of Carolyn Timbrell.

Through the lockdowns, spearheaded by Carolyn, this was a lifeline for many by providing (and delivering) basic essentials that were suddenly hard for some people to access. However, once the immediate pandemic was over sales rapidly fell away.

By then though, Tarragon Newcombe had started renting part of the premises as a café and, when it was decided the shop part of the hub was no longer viable, she took over the whole ground floor and created the hugely successful and much valued T & Cakes we know and love today.

This means the Association's role is now essentially one of building and tenancy management. Most of the time this involves little work but is vital to maintain and support this village owned asset, T & Cakes and the tenant in the basement flat.

Ramblings...

Many, many years ago I stood on the quay side in Liverpool and watched an Atlantic liner sail slowly away. A band played farewell music and many of the crowds were in tears. It was a very sad occasion as I stood with my parents watching the ship sail out of sight with my elder brother on board leaving to go to Canada. We didn't know how long it would be before would see him again and not knowing how we would be able to keep in contact.

As it happened after many years teaching in various parts of Canada, he left with his family to live in Ottawa and took up a post in Amnesty International. This led him to many different parts of the world. He often flew into Heathrow and I was able to catch up with him for a few hours before he caught a connecting flight.

Now retired, he came with my sister-in-law to Gloucestershire in May to stay for ten days. We had four very special days when my two other brothers joined us, something which has not happened for a long time.

On one day the three brothers, all very keen bird watchers, had an amazing day at the Slimbridge Wetland Centre. I decided not to join them as I had never quite understood why they were so passionate about bird watching.

Later on in the week we had a quick trip to North Devon and as we were driving by the Valley of Rocks near Lynton my brother suddenly got out his phone and held it out of the window. He was able to tell us that there was a meadow pipit nearby. We stopped, saw it and could recognise its call.

I immediately got the Merlin app on my phone and from that moment have taken some time in each day to sit in my conservatory, be still and quiet and discover the many birds in my garden. I can now distinguish different bird calls and I also take time to marvel at the wonders of creation and praise God for the start of a new day.

The first day I heard a jackdaw, house sparrow, goldfinch, collared dove, house martin, swift and magpie within ten minutes.

This week I visited a 92year old lady who had fallen and broken her elbow. She has always lived very independently and lived a very active life. She now has many hours on her own. We sat in her garden and she was able to hear the call of a chiff chaff. She now has the Merlin app on her phone and I left her not feeling quite so lonely, and excited to share her new hobby with some of her friends who also live on their own.

By the way I heard a little owl the other day! Maybe I am turning into a twitcher! Jill Stephens
